As with the Season after Pentecost, also known as Ordinary Time, the number of Sundays in Epiphanytide is variable—from five to nine weeks—since the date of Easter changes each year.

If you do not wish to receive communion you are invited to come forward to receive a blessing, indicating your desire by crossing your arms over your chest.

Eligible members can cast their vote for Congregational Council candidates and delegates to the Diocesan Convention following the 8am, 9am, and 11:15am services at Trinity Church on Sunday, March 2, 2025. As defined in the Ordinances, the following persons are entitled to vote: “All persons who on the date of an annual election shall have attained the age of 18 years and who, for the

period of one year preceding such annual election, shall have been duly enrolled on the Congregation’s records as members of the Congregation and shall have partaken of the Holy Communion within said year in the Parish and who shall have contributed to the support of the Parish by a recorded gift of any amount in the preceding

year, and no other persons, shall be entitled to vote at such annual election.” The ballots will be counted after voting closes at 12:45pm and the results of the vote will be announced at the Annual Meeting.
