

ABOUT THIS SERVICE

Allhallowtide

Although in the New Testament "saints" refers to all Christians, the Church soon gave special honor to the heroes of the faith, especially martyrs. The commemoration of The Feast of the Martyrs of the Whole World seems to have been observed in association with Pentecost from the fourth century. The extension of the feast to include All the Saints and its observance on November 1 emerged in the eighth century. Among the seven principal feasts of The Episcopal Church, it is the only one that may be observed both on its fixed date and on the Sunday immediately following.

All Saints' Day is also one of four holy days denoted as especially appropriate for baptisms, along with The Baptism of Our Lord, Easter Vigil, and Pentecost; on this day we join with those who were baptized at the 9am service and renew our baptismal vows.

The annual triduum of All Hallows' Eve, All Saints' Day, and All Faithful Departed reminds us of our communion with all the saints and faithful witnesses who have gone before us, known and unknown.

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.





It is our custom to receive the bread in the upturned palms of our hands, and eat it immediately. Gluten-free wafers are available; please let the minister know that you need one.

Those who wish to receive wine should partake by sipping directly from the chalice (intincting, or dipping one's wafer into the wine, is no longer permitted).

Please use your hands to gently assist the server in guiding the chalice to your lips.

If you do not wish to receive communion you are invited to come forward to receive a blessing, indicating your desire by crossing your arms over your chest.





ABOUT THE MUSIC

Alice Parker collaborated extensively with Robert Shaw to set early American folk hymns. "Saints Bound for Heaven" is a traditional spiritual for SATB voices *a capella* in a lively, joyful setting.

Benedict Sheehan, contemporary composer who also composed *Akathist*—premiered and recorded by Trinity in 2023—is one of the leading voices in classical choral music today. "With the Souls" is taken from his *Ukrainian War Requiem*, using traditional Latin and Ukrainian prayers alongside Jewish melodies to create a Ukrainian memorial service known as the Panakhyda.


