## About this Service

### Family Holy Eucharist

As you participate in this service, the language will feel at once simplified and familiar. Each week, we will pray, sing, and reflect on the Word of God in language that is intentionally accessible for children. At the same time, we draw on the essential elements of Episcopal worship—the Lord's Prayer, the collects, the confession and the creed—learning together to pattern our prayer after the Book of Common Prayer.

In the Baptismal Covenant, the Church vows to support the spiritual development of each new member of the Body of Christ. We often think of this in terms of adults supporting children in their faith formation. In truth, each of us, no matter our age, can help support the spiritual growth of every other member of our church community. One of the many ways we do this is by participating together in worship.

By worshipping together in this way, we can help our children experience the unshakable love of God in Jesus Christ. And adults, in turn, may be surprised to find themselves supported in their lives in Christ by the young people of our community.

# The Reading

*John 21:1-14*

*Please be seated.*

*Reader* A Reading from the Gospel according to John.

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the sea. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

*The Candidates are presented individually by their Parents and Godparents.*

*Parents and Godparents* I present Andrew Sidney Thomas Byers to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*Parents and Godparents* I present Olivia Louise Parker to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*When all have been presented, the Celebrant asks the Parents and Godparents*

*Celebrant* Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents and Godparents* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents and Godparents* I will, with God's help.

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the Parents and Godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.*

*Question* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

## Thanksgiving over the Water

*Celebrant* The Lord be with you.

*People* **And also with you.**

*Celebrant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People* **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

*Celebrant* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water.*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

*All* **Amen.**

## The Baptism

BCP p. 307

*Each Candidate comes to the font with their Parents and/or Godparents, and is presented by name to the Celebrant.*

*The Celebrant pours water upon the Candidate.*

*Celebrant* N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*All* Amen.

*Then the Assisting Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using Chrism.*

*Priest* N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

*All* Amen.

*The Assisting Priest gives the Parents or Godparents of the newly baptized person a candle, lit from the Paschal candle, painted with their name.*

## Sharing of Light

TCWS/BCP p. 308\*

*When this action has been completed for all Candidates, the Celebrant says*

*Celebrant* Beloved, receive the light of Christ as a sign that you have passed from darkness into light.  
Shine as Christ's light in the world.

*All* Amen.

*When each baptismal candle has been received, the congregation stands and the Celebrant says*

*Celebrant* Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

*Celebrant* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

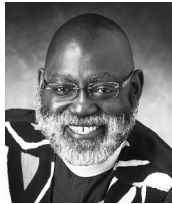

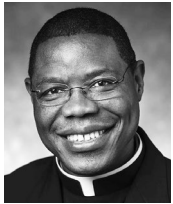
