Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.





Elijah Peace Logan was born on December 1, 2000, in Manhattan at NYU Downtown Hospital. He graduated from Beacon High School in 2018. After high school graduation, he attended Howard University. Upon completion of his first year of college, he chose to take a year off and devote himself to working with VOCAL NY. VOCAL NY is a statewide grassroots membership organization that builds power among low-income people affected by HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, the drug war, homelessness, and mass incarceration in order to create healthy and just communities. At VOCAL Elijah used his empathy and love for fellow humans to raise awareness and funds for the people VOCAL serves. His determination to eradicate injustice made him decide to work in the public sector. Elijah enrolled in Medgar Evers College to pursue a degree in public administration.

Elijah had many passions that included martial arts, politics, music, wrestling, food, and fashion. Elijah reached the level of second-degree black belt in Okinawa Shorin-ryu Karate by the time he was 18. Politics and current events were some of Elijah's first interests. He could talk for hours about the history of regimes and how the world we know now came to be. Elijah's love of music had him creating the music for his middle school teacher's app and then spending much of his time in Beacon's music classes and studios. At Beacon he joined the wrestling team and worked hard to master the techniques and strategy with his teammates. Elijah's creativity in the kitchen as well as his wardrobe knew no bounds. He was born with his culinary acumen always suggesting things to add when his mom cooked. It always made the food taste better. As he got older, he attended camp at the Culinary Institute. Elijah wanted the freshest ingredients for the meals he created and prepared the best meals for family and friends, made with skill and love. Elijah always sought out the newest young unknown designers in the fashion world to support with his hard-earned dollars, most of whom went on to be renowned in the fashion world. Elijah's smile melted hard hearts and warmed everyone that met him. He was kind, gentle, and loving, and he always helped people who were in need. Elijah was fiercely protective of those he loved and wasn't afraid to let you know it.

On September 25, 2022, Elijah Peace Logan entered eternal life at the young age of 21. Elijah's spirit is carried on by his mother, Deanna, his twin brother Walter, grandparents Leonie and Eric, Aunt Gale, his godmother Nadine Nader, and first cousin Kai along with countless cousins, great aunts, great uncles, and friends who will always love him.






