

# About this Service Epiphanytide

In the Episcopal Church, the season of Epiphany bridges the liturgical seasons of Christmastide (a festive season) and Lent (a penitential season). As with the Season of Pentecost, also known as Ordinary Time, the number of Sundays in Epiphanytide is variable—from five to nine weeks—since the date of Easter changes each year.

On these final days of the Epiphany Season, "alleluia, alleluia" is added to the dismissal, since that word will not appear again in services until the Great Vigil of Easter.
