About this Service

Pentecost

Pentecost, celebrated fifty days after Easter Sunday, is one of the principal feasts of The Episcopal Church, and is commonly regarded as the birthday of the broader Christian Church. On this day, as described in the reading from Acts appointed for the Day of Pentecost, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit—the third person of the Trinity—to his disciples, as he had foretold in his teaching. As is common with many feast days pertaining to Jesus' apostles, it is customary to wear red vestments to symbolize the “tongues, as of fire” that inspired them to preach the Gospel in other languages.

Pentecost is also one of the four holy days (along with the Easter Vigil, The Baptism of Our Lord, and All Saints' Day) especially suitable for Holy Baptism, as well as for confirmation, reception, and reaffirmation: sacramental rites which can only be performed by a bishop. Today we welcome the Rt. Rev. Andrew ML Dietsche, the 16th Bishop of New York, to preach and preside as these new and renewing Christians join Trinity Church.

The Second Reading

1 Corinthians 12:3b–13

Reader

A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

No one can say “Jesus is Lord” except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Celebrant We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

The Baptism

BCP p. 307

Each Candidate comes to the font with their Sponsor, Parents and/or Godparents, and is presented by name to the Vicar.

The Vicar pours water upon the Candidate.

Vicar N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All **Amen.**

Then the Celebrant places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using Chrism.

Celebrant N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

Sharing of Light

Light is passed from the Paschal Candle to all of the baptismal candles.

When this action has been completed for all Candidates, the Celebrant says

Celebrant Beloved, receive the light of Christ as a sign that you have passed from darkness into light. Shine as Christ's light in the world.

When each baptismal candle has been received, the congregation stands and the Celebrant says

Celebrant Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

Celebrant Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All **We receive you into the household of God.
Confess the faith of Christ crucified,
proclaim his resurrection,
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

At Confirmation, Reception, and Reaffirmation

Celebrant Let us now pray for these persons who have renewed their commitment to Christ.

Silence

Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at their Baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

For Confirmation

Each Candidate kneels before the Celebrant. The Celebrant lays hands upon the Candidate, saying

Celebrant Strengthen, O Lord, your servant *N.* with your Holy Spirit; empower *him* for your service; and sustain *him* all the days of *his* life.

Celebrant Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

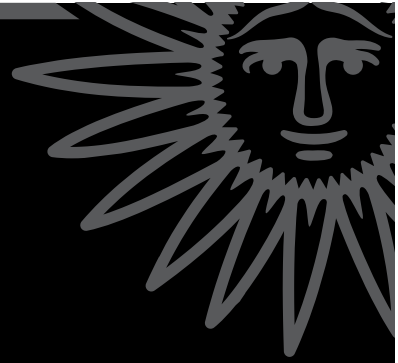

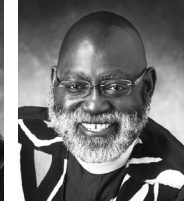
