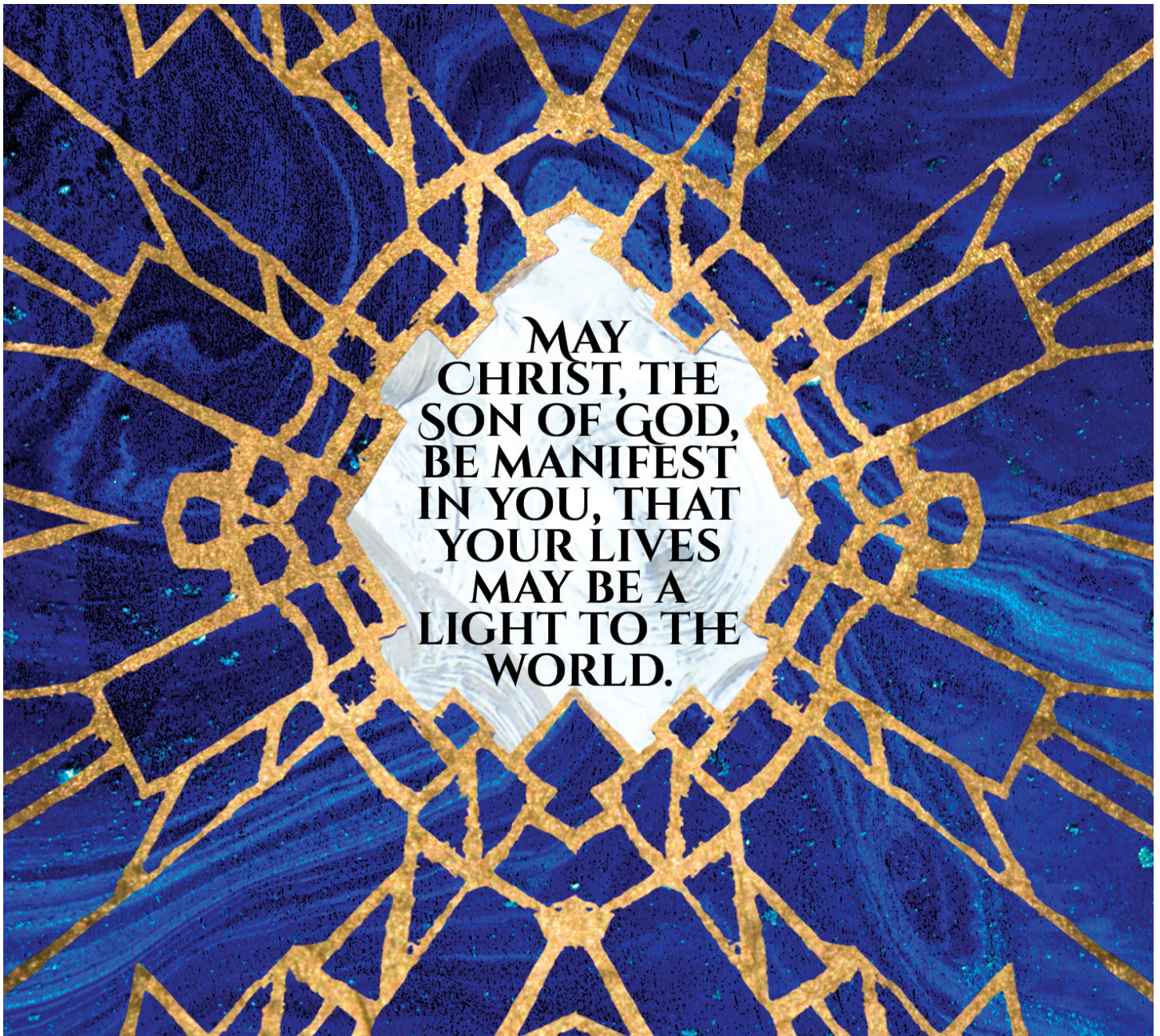

About this Service

Epiphanytide

In the Episcopal Church, the season of Epiphany bridges the liturgical seasons of Christmastide (a festive season) and Lent (a penitential season). As with the Season after Pentecost, also known as Ordinary Time, the number of Sundays in Epiphanytide is variable—from five to nine weeks—since the date of Easter changes each year.

Those who wish to receive wine should partake by sipping directly from the chalice (intincting, or dipping one's wafer into the wine, is no longer permitted). Please use your hands to gently assist the server in guiding the chalice to your lips.

If you do not wish to receive communion you are invited to come forward to receive a blessing, indicating your desire by crossing your arms over your chest.

“Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct your paths” (*Proverbs 3:5–6* MEV). When this verse was sent to me, I was recovering from a corrective jaw surgery. I read this verse especially when I felt uncomfortable being homebound for 6–8 weeks. I couldn't eat, walk, drive, exercise, and go back to work. When I finally returned to work, this verse helped me with the new principal and his ideologies he was imposing to the staff. Finally, this verse helped me during mother's illness and the home attendants that were taking care of her. —Winifred Murdaugh
